- Are local fire service and emergency response issues included in your campaign platform?
Yes, on my website, my walk pieces, and in my stump speech. I believe protecting our residents' safety and our responders' contracts are of utmost importance.
- What is your position on public safety regionalization?
Regionalization can be a great tool for small cities to use economies of scale to have access to specialized expensive equipment they otherwise could not afford, but care must be taken that staff sizes are not reduced when regionalization occurs.
- Are you aware of the multi jurisdictional complexity of the Alameda County Fire Department? Please explain.

I am. Alameda County Fire Department covers the unincorporated portions of Alameda County, as well as Berkeley and Livermore National Labs and the cities of Dublin, Newark, Union City, San Leandro, and Emeryville. This leaves large gaps in the where Alameda County Fire Department is not the primary responder. Automatic and mutual aid agreements further complicate the picture.

- Will you oppose the closing of any fire company or fire station if it can be proven it will increase emergency response times beyond standards set by nationally accepted agencies? Please Explain.

Yes. It is part of my platform to protect response times.

- Firefighters are exposed to illness and disease from patients and carcinogens during fires. Do you fully support lifetime medical coverage for our members?

Yes, I do.
